How Quarantine Helps Us Remember the Past

What evidence can be found and what is missing from the Quarantine landscape story? Using the site itself as a primary source, students will reflect thoughtfully on the nature and consequence of first contacts between Aboriginal people and the early European settlers in Sydney Harbour.

In doing so, they will gain an empathetic understanding of the differing cultural perspectives of this significant site and its historical human occupation.

What will you do on the tour?

Enjoy a 2 hour guided tour around site, visiting a variety of our historical buildings. Students will examine the diversity of the area and the historical features in this beautiful location, while discovering the national and local significance of this site.

Our expert guides are there to work with any particular focus area you may have, and prior knowledge the students may have, and can adjust their tour based on your group's requirements.
