Site Study

Site studies enable students to understand their historical environment and participate actively in historical inquiry. The Quarantine Station Site Study reveals the historical phases and changes of the site throughout its history.

Exploration and investigation of artefacts, primary and secondary sources allow students to use historical language and locate select and organise information in the context of this evocative place.

What will you do on the tour?

Students will complete a historical based site study evidencing the social, economic, religious and political beliefs that were often challenged and significantly changed. They will evaluate the changes in buildings over time, and use site evidence to examine the stages of quarantine.
