STAGE 6: DEATH, DISEASE AND DIVISION

Investigation of Historic Sites and Sources

Students investigate our significant historic site; stories, sources and artifacts including the built environment, consider the contribution of archaeology and science and apply historical inquiry skills to gain a greater understanding of the chronology of the former Quarantine Station.

Q Station is suggested as a site to investigate in the NSW Modern History Curriculum and has a dedicated chapter in the textbook Modern History Transformed by Cambridge University Press – The Investigation of Historical Sites and Sources: Death, Disease and Division at the Quarantine Station.

What will you do on the tour?

Students will investigate the importance of maintaining the historical site for its significant place in Australian history through analyzing building reconstructions, comparing the past and present and understanding advancements and changes in medicine, travel and quarantine policies, students will complete Wharf Exploration and Inscription activities.
