HOSPITALITY THROUGH TIME: LEARNING FROM Q STATION'S LEGACY

Changes & Challenges of Hospitality in Isolation

This program enables students to understand a unique hospitality environment and its context. It explores the history of hospitality, covering its past and present management at Australia's largest and longest running Quarantine Station, and its role in the development of Australian hospitality through the 19th to 21st century.

The main focus is on the evolution of hospitality management, where students will learn from current staff how it is managed today and comparing it with the past. The program will combine historical storytelling with practical examples of how the site has evolved and continues to operate within the modern hospitality industry. Evaluating the changes in key operational buildings over time with site evidence helps students examine management changes in hospitality.

What will you do on the tour?

Students will explore the evolution of hospitality management at Q Station, from its historical roots as a quarantine station to its current role as a heritage hotel and event venue on a national park. Site wide observations of practice will take place, noting on the day bookings across the site for current uses in business.
